St Francis', Dundee, will close today after Evening Mass.

A spokesperson for the Diocese of Dunkeld said, "This is a sad day for all of us, especially parishioners of St Francis.

"Bishop Logan has already said it was a very, very difficult decision to make, but, given the advice he and the Trustees were given regarding the work needing to be done on the building, a building the diocese does not own, he had no alternative.

"Furthermore, our clergy are getting older, and many men who should be retired, are continuing with their ministry, striving to serve the people of the diocese as best they can, with an increasingly onerous workload.

"Bishop Logan is very grateful to the priests and people, for the loyal commitment they have shown to St Francis over the years. His hope and his prayer now is that they will take their talents and loyalty to their new parishes and continue to enrich the life of the diocese."

Some of the parishioners from St Francis' will become part of our parish community from next weekend. I am sure we will extend to them a warm welcome as we did to parishioners of St Teresa's.

Our schools return on Wednesday of this week. We wish a happy year to all staff and pupils, especially those starting in Primary 1 and those beginning their secondary education in St John's High.

The Diocese is sending some 31 young people to WORLD YOUTH DAY in Madrid in 2011. We will be represented by James Hendry & Jenny Grewer.




Two S6 pupils from every Catholic secondary school in Scotland are joining in a Scottish pilgrimage to Twickenham to participate in the Big Assembly of over 3,000 young people who will gather to meet Pope Benedict XVI.

Rachel Delaney and Kieran Kane will represent St John's High School.

Fr Ken, as Vice President of the Catholic Education Commission will travel to London with them

The Holy Father, Pope Benedict XVI was elected the 265th successor of St Peter on 19 April 2005. His Holiness is only the second non-Italian pope since 1522 - the other being his much-loved predecessor Pope John Paul II. To date, Pope Benedict has visited 15 countries including Malta and Portugal this year before arriving in the UK for his four-day visit.



MASS IN GLASGOW

We have been allocated 238 tickets for the Papal Mass in Bellahouston Park in Glasgow on Thursday 16th September.

Deacon Charles will be the Pilgrim Leader for our parish. Fr Ken will be attending the Education event in St Mary's College, London, on Friday 17th September, with 2 senior pupils from our Catholic Secondary Schools

If you wish to attend you should add your name, address and telephone number to the sheets provided at the back of the Church. Transport from Dundee will be provided. Pilgrims cannot travel as individuals.

Please note that you will need to be in Bellahouston Park by 3.00 p.m. Mass will begin at 5.15 p.m.. Due to the large numbers in attendance it will take some time to empty the park. By 7.30 p.m., it will be dark. Arrival and departure times for coaches will be staggered to ensure they meet necessary deadlines and ensure a flow of traffic. The park will be exposed and there will be no weather protection. Pilgrims should be physically able to cope with this. The past average maximum temperature for this date for the last 5 years has been 7 Celsius and the lowest 1 Celsius. Seating will not be provided. No person under 18 years of age will be allocated an invitation without ensuring that they have proper supervision.

Secondary school pupils may travel with their school [if arranged by the school].

Parents may absent their children from school on 16th September if they wish to take them to Glasgow.
