**MARY'S MEALS APPEAL 2010**

Mary's Meals is a feeding programme designed not only to feed the poorest children in the world but to actively encourage them to attend school. Mary's Meals feeds approximately half a million children every day and for some this is their only meal of the day.

The programme has been a huge success and the numbers attending school on a regular basis has increased dramatically. However these children lack the very basic school equipment that children in the western world take for granted e.g pencils, paper.


The Back Pack Project aims to provide at least some of these children with the basic items they need.

The Vatican has announced final details of the Papal Visit Programme. On September 16 the Holy Father will leave Rome at 8:10 a.m. and arrive at the Edinburgh International Airport at 10:30 a.m.

Shortly after, the Pontiff will attend a welcoming ceremony at the Royal Palace of Holyroodhouse in Edinburgh, where he will make a courtesy visit to Queen Elizabeth II.

At 11:40 a.m., the Holy Father will address the authorities in the park of the palace, after which he will depart for lunch in the archbishop's residence in that same city. His route will take him via Princes Street where a St Ninian's Day Pageant will be held, culminating in the Holy Father's driving along the street in the Popemobile.

That evening, Benedict XVI will celebrate an open air Mass at 5:15 p.m. in Bellahouston Park in Glasgow. After the Mass, he will depart by plane from Glasgow to London.


The Vatican spokesman Fr Federico Lombardi says the Pope is looking forward to his day in Scotland at the start of his visit to Britain next month. At a briefing in Rome, Fr Lombardi said that the Pope's first-day Scottish leg of the trip - which includes a meeting with the Queen - was "awaited with great intensity and emotion."

"I would like to remind people, moreover, that the day the Pope will be in Scotland is the feast of St. Ninian, the evangelizer of Scotland," Father Lombardi noted. "Hence it is a very important day for the Scots."

Father Lombardi classified the closing vigil of the British visit in Hyde Park and the beatification of Cardinal John Henry Newman as the "spiritual heart of this visit." He mentioned the bond that unites the Holy Father to Cardinal Newman, a poet and Anglican pastor, subsequently received into the Catholic Church and made a cardinal by Pope Leo XIII.

He added: "I would say that what is expected, what can be desired, truly hoped for from this visit is the fact of making it understood, of presenting the service of the Christian faith and the service of the Catholic Church for a very developed but also a very secularized society, such as that of the United Kingdom.

"We hope that this trip will also be a manifestation of the beauty, of the positiveness of the Holy Father's service in society, much more so in times in which we also have had moments of controversy."



## MASS IN GLASGOW

Further practical details have been released on the arrangements for the Holy Father's Mass in Glasgow on 16 September 2010.

**What you can bring** - If you wish, you may bring: banners and flags; blankets for the ground; small folding chairs, cushions and kneelers for comfort; torches; camera

**What you need to bring** - Clothing provision for all weather conditions; medication needed; emergency contact numbers; your Papal Visit handbook; your Pilgrim Pack and identification

**What not to bring** - alcohol; gazebos; canopies; BBQs; animals (except registered assistance dogs); open flames (e.g. candles); musical instruments; whistles; bicycles; standing platforms; glass items of any type; compressed gas cylinders and other fuel containers.

**Some basic advice:** Please try to minimise what you will need to carry; give your mobile number to your Pilgrim Leader; it would be a good idea to exchange mobile numbers within your Pilgrim Group. Pilgrim Passes need to be worn at all times and should be fitted on departure from your Pilgrim Point. If you become unwell prior to the Pilgrimage, please remain at home and inform your Pilgrim Leader, in the interests of your own health and others.
