## RITE OF ENROLMENT






## LENT 2012

**Jagadeesh is learning a trade with SCIAF partner, the Association of People with Disabilities (APD) in India. Here is his story**

Manjunath and his wife are "coolies", an Indian term for casual labourers. They earn just £1.30 a day. They work extremely hard, but they never know whether there will be enough work for them day to day. If they have no work, the family has very little food to go round.

They have two sons, both are deaf. It is difficult enough living poverty, however, the challenge becomes even greater when extra help is needed for those with disabilities. It was difficult for their parents to see how they could give Jagadeesh and his brother the started in life they deserved.

Life is hard. Three times a day they must walk to the nearest water point 1km away and the rent for the room the family shares is tough to find. Can you imagine bringing up your child in these conditions? Given Jagadeesh's disability, it is much harder to give him the chances any proud parent wants to give to their child.

There is little state support for those with disabilities in India and Manjunath cannot afford to pay fees for special education. The prospects for Jagadeesh looked increasingly bleak.

But thanks SCIAF supporters and their generosity we are helping Jagadeesh to build a future for himself. SCIAF's partner, the Association of People with Disabilities, has been teaching Jagadeesh sign language and written English to improve his communication.

Jagadeesh is also completing a two year metal work course which will give him the skills he needs to get a job, earn money and become independent. **Jagadeesh said:**

*"The fitter (metal work) course will help me in the future to lead my life and become independent. I want to be able to work and earn money so I can contribute to my family and help them. APD has also helped me with my communication skills. Before I couldn't communicate with anyone properly. To people in Scotland I say thank you for helping me. It's going to make a difference."*

Your donations have helped provide a chance at a future to people like Jagadeesh. Doing something WEE can make a big difference this Lent
