## ***A Message from Cardinal Keith O'Brien***

Dear friends

Over the years I have had the pleasure of visiting many of the countries in which SCIAF works around the world. Although the people of these countries face different challenges, they share something in common - SCIAF'S work is giving them real hope.

It has been truly humbling to witness the courage and resilience of these people and to see at first hand how the Catholic community in Scotland is helping to transform their lives. Nowhere is this transformation more striking than in Burundi, where genocide and civil war have taken a devastating toll on the country and its people.

Through SCIAF we reach out in love to the poorest and most vulnerable of our global neighbours, offering practice support so that people can work their own way out of poverty. In Burundi, this work is healing broken communities by helping people to forgive, to resolve their differences and come together to build lasting peace. It is also providing tools, seeds and training so that families can grow enough to eat.

Peace has provided a solid foundation upon which the people of Burundi can begin to grow and prosper. This growth can be seen in the fields of crops, which communities depend on for food. It can be seen in the friendships that are blossoming in villages, which until recently, were divided by suspicion and mistrust.

Lent, beginning on Wednesday of this week, is a time for prayer, penance and fasting, but it provides us with an opportunity to demonstrate love, compassion and solidarity with those in need. In this Year of Faith, let us bear witness to Christ by offering the hand of friendship to those less fortunate than ourselves and by acting to create a just world for all.
