THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

We have had several requests for the celebration of the Sacrament of Baptism in recent weeks.

If you wish to have your child baptised, you should be in touch with the priest or deacon well before the birth of the child as there is a special prayer card for expectant mothers.

The baptism of a child is a joyous occasion for a family, but it is also a joyous occasion for the parish as we welcome a new member into our faith community. Parents who are preparing to have their child baptized are required to attend participate in our short Baptismal Preparation Program led by Mary Margaret Wilson. At baptism, the parents accept the responsibility to bring up the child in the practice of the faith. They become the first teachers of the faith for their children in what is called the Domestic Church.

If Baptism is requested for children who are not infants, there is a more detailed preparation necessary.

Parents who request Baptism are expected to be active members of the faith community who are regular attend Mass here in this parish as it is through their example and witness that parents will help children grow as active members of the Body of Christ.

MARY'S MEAL'S BACKPACK PROJECT

Most of the children who benefit from Mary's Meals and the Backpack Project have suffered war, poverty, famine, or natural disaster. Very often families cannot afford to buy basic things like pencils and copy books, or even suitable clothes for their children to wear to school. And so their children miss out on school and an education. A simple backpack with educational materials can be a lifeline to these children as studies show that an education is the best way a chronically poor child can escape poverty in later life.
